The Sydney Edible Garden Trail will be held from 21 - 22 March and will feature more than 60 private and community edible gardens.

The mission of the team of volunteer coordinators is to encourage and inspire growing edible produce in urban gardens and public spaces across Sydney.

Coordinator Laurie Green said, "We want to celebrate the many ways that Sydney residents are creating food security, saving money and the environment, while enjoying the health benefits of home-grown fruit and vegetables".

If you've ever wondered just what's involved in growing your own food or are interested in finding out more about keeping chickens, growing in drought conditions, crop swapping, worm farms, and more, there'll be lots of local passionate gardeners ready to share their knowledge.

The self-guided trail will showcase sustainable practices such as mulching for water conservation, recycling and composting to increase soil fertility and reduce landfill, planting to encourage bees, home food production to increase food security, and organic growing techniques to reduce chemical use. Some gardens will be holding free workshops, selling seedlings, free seed saving demonstrations, crop swaps and more.
